As you read this newsletter, we will have completed three weeks of public exams so far this term at both GCSE and A Level. Students have worked incredibly hard to get to this point and have been very well supported by our teachers and support staff. If you have a child in Year 11 or 13, I am sure you have felt the pressure too but please keep up the love, nurture and cajoling for another few weeks. Inspectors were incredibly complimentary about our students whose behaviour and attitudes over the two days were exceptional. They also paid tribute to the quality of experience our students received in their lessons and could clearly see why St Peter's has produced such great academic outcomes over the last few years.

One specific aspect of school life they highlighted was attendance which is amongst the best in the country for state secondary schools. Like us, Ofsted see attendance as one of the most significant factors
